We continue to sing! North Zone Women's Forum for Life

Close to 70 women from Honduras' Northern Zone celebrated March 8th, International Women's Day, by taking a bus tour through five different municipalities in order to commemorate our struggle and resistance and to keep alive the memory of our sisters who have been assassinated.

The bus, which left San Pedro Sula at 8:00 a.m., was covered with banners, purple balloons, photos of the murdered women, and messages such as: "to honour your memory, we will not allow your death to be dismissed with impunity," "for you we will continue the struggle" and "we mourn the loss of these women." The bus made a stop in San Pedro's Liberty Plaza, where the first "torch of life" was passed to a group of women who were remaining in the city to participate in various other Women's Day activities. From San Pedro, the bus travelled on to the municipalities of Choloma, El Progreso, Pimienta and Potrerillos.

At each stop, groups of women had prepared a beautiful welcome. In return, they received *a torch of life*, which represents our commitment to never forget the murdered women and to continue the struggle in their name, in our name, and in the name of the women who are yet to come.

Inside the bus, we sang, we laughed, we dreamed. But most importantly, we remembered those women who are no longer with us, but who will always accompany us in our hearts.

On this March 8th, we, the women of the Northern Zone, declare our commitment to the sisters that are no longer with us, to ourselves, to the women who are yet to come, and to our people. We commit ourselves to an ongoing struggle to recover each and every one of our institutions and achievements. We declare that we are no longer satisfied with small changes, or minimal concessions. We are here to transform this country and the violent and patriarchal system that has dominated our Honduras. We, the women of the Northern Zone, commit ourselves to constructing a new country.

Today, we are filled with strength to resist. We are filled with desire to struggle. Today, we are filled with hope and utopias that inspire us to struggle on.
